Information concerning processing of personal data ex art. 13 of the EU Regulation 2016/679

In accordance to the EU Regulation 2016/679 (infra: “Regolamento”), we inform you that your personal data will be handled by MOTTURA S.p.A. with its headquarter in S.Giusto Canavese (TO), Via XXV Luglio 1, as Data Controller (hereinafter “Titolare”).

The Ownership will handle your personal data for the following purposes:

- Management of sending required information by using the contact form

Legal basis for the processing is the performance of a contract to which the data subject is party or in under to take steps at the request of the data subject prior to entering into a contract (art. 6(1)(b)) of the Regulation).

- The personal data granting for the above mentioned purpose is optional, but in their absence, it will not be possible to go ahead with requesting information.

Your personal data can be shared with:

- Physical persons authorized by the data controller after the signing of a nondisclosure agreement (e.g. employees and system administrators);
- Third parties involved in managing the activities related to the above purposes, some of them acting as data controllers (for the full and updated list of controllers, please contact privacy@mottura.com);
- Persons, entities or authorities to whom it is mandatory to submit your personal data in accordance with provisions laid down by law.

The data controller does not transfer your personal data in countries that are not members of the European Union.

Your personal data will be retained for 24 months.

At any time you have the right to contact the Data Handling Owner for the access to your personal data, the rectification or deletion of the same, the restriction of the processing of data and to obtain your data in a structured format, commonly and machine-readable, in the circumstances provided for in art. 20 of the Regulation.

Such a request shall be submitted in writing to the Data Controller at the following e-mail address privacy@mottura.com.

Anyway you have always the right to lodge a complaint with the competent control authority (Personal Data Protection Authority), pursuant to art. 77 of the Regulation, if you consider that processing of your personal data is contrary to the existing legislation
